### News and appeals

#### **Can you name these three Chichester golf club theft suspects? (Image attached)**

At 2.45pm on Thursday 14 September the two men who are seen together, both in dark clothing, came into the shop at the Chichester Golf Club at Hoe Farm, Selsey Road.

One of them is seen to be making a phone call and the third man, aged about 30, with short dark hair, wearing a white top, then enters separately and takes two M2 drivers valued together at £859.98.

Meanwhile the pair in black stay in the shop, though off camera, standing so as to block the view the sales assistant would have had of the man in white,

#### **Missing Michael McEntee found safe**

Michael McEntee, reported missing from Graffham near Petworth, has been found safe.

The 63-year-old was located in the area on Saturday morning (7 October).

#### **Ni Shi Xiong, 17, missing from Chichester (Image attached)**

Police are concerned for the welfare of a missing Chinese boy, Ni Shi Xiong, who has disappeared in West Sussex.

Xiong, 17, was last seen at 11am on Friday, September 22, in Chichester.

He is described as being of south-east Asian appearance, 5' 6", of slim build, with cropped

black hair in 'curtain' style and a tanned complexion.

He was last seen wearing a green and black camouflage jacket worn over a black hooded top, tight blue jeans and white trainers without socks.

He does not speak English and there are concerns that he may be particularly vulnerable because of this.

### **Arrest summary**

Between the 4th - 11th October, more than 20 people were arrested from across the Chichester District. Offences included drug driving, shoplifting, theft of a pedal cycle, driving whilst under the influence of alcohol and harassment.

One man was arrested in Easebourne after the vehicle he was driving was stopped by Police. He was found to be in possession of large amount of cannabis and he was arrested on suspicion of possession with intent to supply, possession of an offensive weapon and driving whilst under the influence of drugs. He was released pending further investigation.
